INVITATION

The University of Gdańsk Samuel Beckett Seminar will be held on 12th and 13th May 2021 as part of the Between.Pomiędzy Festival of Literature and Theatre. Our intention is to respond to the unprecedented relevance of contemporary topics like incessant waiting, overwhelming frustration, uncertain futures, and enforced isolation to the lives of people around the world. We are well aware that artistic representations of typically Beckettian themes are no longer matters for highbrow speculation conducted just among scholars but have become part of the common experience of everyone. Concentrating on the ways in which artistic achievements of Beckett have triggered enormous creativity in the virtual world (in Wuhan, Moscow, Warsaw, Dublin, Tallahassee, Worcester, Boston, and elsewhere), we also intend to take this occasion to review several activities of the research group, including a laboratory film, *Beckett on the Baltic* (by SE Gontarski), and various forms of approaching *Ohio Impromptu*, a miniature that Beckett sent to Gontarski forty years ago this year.
