Present-day translation and interpreting research: A myriad of approaches, a multitude of methods

The topics of interest to researchers dealing with translation and interpreting seem as diverse as the methods used to explore them. Particular branches of Holmes' map (1972) have developed significantly over the last fifty years, and Translation and Interpreting Studies (TIS) have been rapidly transforming into a highly heterogeneous field of research. The approaches adopted in particular projects draw on various theories formulated within different disciplines and paradigms, which fully justifies viewing TIS as an interdiscipline. Yet, despite wide diversity, it is often possible to discern some common ground and shared interests, e.g. in the factors that shape translation and interpreting processes and products, or in the agents that participate in these processes. In this special issue, we would like to show the variety of current research on translation- and interpreting-related phenomena, not forgetting that in every case, its aim is to gain further insight into a complex operation on languages and cultures. Thus, our objective is to bring together researchers from diverse backgrounds, having experience with assorted research tools, in order to seek unity and appreciate diversity.
